ABOUT THE NATIONAL DIGITAL LIBRARY OF INDIA

National Digital Library of India (NDLI) is a comprehensive virtual repository of learning resources designed to serve a diverse learner community. Sponsored and mentored by the Ministry of Education, Government of India, under the National Mission on Education through Information and Communication Technology (NMEICT), NDLI is developed, operated and maintained by the Indian Institute of Technology, Kharagpur. As of April 2025, the platform offers 125 million digital resources and has 94 million registered users, demonstrating its nationwide reach. Its federated search architecture, built on open-source technologies, supports a high volume of concurrent queries, ensuring swift and reliable access even during peak demand. NDLI delivers tailored services for school and college students, job aspirants, researchers and lifelong learners. It accommodates content in all languages and currently supports search in the 14 most widely used Indian languages, making it a truly multilingual and inclusive platform. Accessible via both web and mobile app, NDLI organizes content across dedicated domains- School Education, Higher Education, Research, Career Development, Cultural Archives, Judicial Resources, Newspaper Archives, and Patents & Standards. Beyond aggregation, NDLI develops high-quality learning modules for major national competitive examinations such as JEE, NEET and various government recruitment tests. The NDLI Cluboutreach initiative promotes activity-based learning in alignment with NEP 2020, helping students and educators make the most of the platform.

CENTRAL LIBRARY

Established in 1951 as the first institute of the IIT system, IIT Kharagpur was founded to advance knowledge in areas of national and global significance. With over 770 faculty members, more than 900 staff and a community of 15,000 students and researchers, the institute pursues broad-based education to equip learners with best-in-class professional capabilities.

The Central Library is the institute's learning hub, offering a conducive environment across six air-conditioned reading halls that can seat over 2,000 users simultaneously. It operates from 8 AM to midnight on regular days and provides round-the-clock access for 15 days during semester examinations. The Library subscribes to more than 2,76,000 print books, 26,466 e-journals, over 257,726 e-books and 31 electronic databases as of March 31 2025. It also holds subscriptions to standards from ASME, SAE, ISO, BIS, IEC and ASTM, and provides access to all major publisher e-journals via the One Nation One Subscription (ONOS) Phase-I scheme. Various digital library services are continuously rendered to meet the needs of its user community.

Paper must be written in English and should adhere to academic standards.

- Submissions should be in .doc or .docx format and follow a standard academic paper structure.
- The maximum paper length should not exceed 3000 words, Page Size- A4, Single line space.
- Font Name: Times New Roman, and Size: 12pt
- Authors should mention sub-theme of the paper (choose from the list of themes of the symposium).
- Title, abstract (250 words maximum), six keywords, and author affiliations with contact information.
- References (APA Style 6th ed.).

- Please comply the plagiarism percentage as per UGC guidelines of the manuscript and attached the report at the time of submission.
- All submissions must be original work and should not have been previously published or be under review.
- Tables and Figures may be incorporated into the text of the paper.
- NDLI holds the copyright of the selected papers, which will be published at the symposium.

Selected papers will be presented at the symposium and published in the proceedings only if at least one author register in the symposium.

TRANSPORTATION

IIT Kharagpur enjoys excellent connectivity via both rail and air. The closest railway stations are Kharagpur and Hijli. One can get taxi/ toto/ rickshaw from railway station, it will take hardly 15 minutes to reach the venue. The closest airport is Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose International Airport (CCU) in Kolkata, which is approximately 140 km away. The journey from the airport to IIT Kharagpur can take about 3 hours by road.

VISA REQUIREMENT

Citizens of all countries, except Nepal and Bhutan, require a valid Visa granted by Indian Missions Abroad for entering India. Those wishing to visit a neighbouring country like Sri Lanka or Nepal and then return to India should obtain a double/multiple entry Visa. Upon confirmation of registration, the Organizing Committee shall issue the necessary documents as required for obtaining Visa from the Indian consulate of the country of the applicant.
